



## TAE Guided Cavern Dives 2021

Guided cavern dives in the local cenotes are available for all levels of certified divers. Cenotes known as “windows” are freshwater swimming pools that give us a view into the vast underground cave systems. These cenotes not only offer amazing visibility well in excess of 45 meters/150 feet, stalactites and stalagmites of every shape and size, and light zones that will dazzle your eyes but some are even open to the ocean and offer sealife and animals such as manatees that live in both salt and freshwater.

Cavern dives are guided safely by our professional guides within the light zone and guided cavern standards accepted worldwide. Our cavern guides carry minimum certifications of full cave diver and dive master by a recognized training agency. Often they are cavern or cave diving instructors with hundreds or thousands of dives in the local environment. Maximum allowed ratio of divers to guide is four to one.

Our typical day of guided cavern diving includes two single tank dives in two different cenotes or 1 or 2 cenote and 1 or 2 ocean reef dives.
